Distance Teaching

The Public Health Agency (Folkhälsomyndigheten) recommends that secondary schools (gymnasier) in Sweden move over to distance learning/teaching.

Malmö Stad's secondary schools are ready for the transition to distance learning. Teachers and staff will meet during the study day on Wednesday (18/3) to make the final adjustments so that remote learning and teaching can be in effect from Thursday (19/3), until further notice.

This does not mean that the schools are closed. All students can access the school in order to pick up laptops, books, notes and other material that may be needed in order to study online from home. The student health care team will also be on site for students.

Lunch will not be served as long as this situation remains.

Students must use their @skola.malmo.se account in order to access Malmö Apps, and thereby also access distance teaching and material. Malmö Apps can be accessed not only through the student's laptop but also through other computers, tablets, and mobile phones as long as there is internet access.

It is the duty of every student to stay at home and at the same time take responsibility for his/her learning, and to follow classes.

We also want to encourage all legal guardians/parents to support their students to make sure that they understand the importance of following the distance learning and take responsibility for their studies.
